The Textile Fashion Center is a creative center for culture, science, innovation, and business built around the area's traditional history as a center of textile and fashion. The textile machines of Simonsland -cradle of Sweden's textile industry- stopped making noise a long time ago. Yet the neighborhood's old buildings remain. Today Simonsland is internationally recognized as a center of textile and garment enterprises. The collaboration

of the Textile Museum and the University of Borås has produced the Textile Fashion Center, which merges enterprise and heritage.
