


#### Museums in Alberta




Alberta has over 220 museums, most of which focus on the early history of the province after settlement







#### **Impact of Museums**

In Alberta, there are over 220 Museums, Zoos, Science Centres, & Art Galleries

Number of Museum Professionals in Canada = 24,000 Number of Volunteers in Museums = 55,000

Number of Museum Visits in Canada = 59 million 60% of international tourists visit Canada's museums

• Indirect Economic Contribution in Canada = \$17 billion
